


When advertisement flashed on TV, I muted it and asked Arnav, "Do you know, Junglee Joker has done another trick to beat Little Singham..."


Arnav with little doubt, "Really, we are not going to fight and beat them?"

"Definitely, tell them also, so that they can also fight with corona."


In a fraction of second he ran to his grandparents to tell his secret weapon.






Politeness and Honesty



Follow these guidelines and you should make the right impression when you talk to people.


- 1. Listen and be understanding.

Tree Plantation Activity









मैं खुश हूँ..!



Joseph both had a strong faith in God, despite the difficulties they faced.


